CONSTITUTION

Preamble

The name of this body shall be Concord Baptist Association. It is composed of cooperating Southern Baptist Churches whose confession of faith affirms the Word of God as its guide for faith and practice, and supports the principles, beliefs, and programs of the Concord Baptist Association, the Tennessee Baptist Convention, and the Southern Baptist Convention.

Article I – Purpose

The purpose of this association shall be:

1. To foster fellowship among the churches cooperating with this association.
2. To assist the churches in strengthening their ministries of enlistment, evangelism, teaching, and training.
3. To encourage the churches in the promotion of missions and the establishment of new churches.
4. To promote those ministries of the Tennessee Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention as it may deem proper.
5. To promote the Mission Statement, Vision Statement and Core Values of the association.

Article II – Membership

A church may be a member of Concord Baptist Association upon fulfilling the following criteria:

1. A church shall affirm the Word of God as its guide for faith and practice, and support the principles, beliefs, and ministries of the Concord Baptist Association, the Tennessee Baptist Convention, and the Southern Baptist Convention.
2. A church shall petition the association through the Administrative Leadership Team.
3. The association reserves the right to withdraw membership from a member church or withhold membership from a petitioning church which does not affirm the Word of God as its guide for faith and practice, and does not support the principles, beliefs, and ministries of the Concord Baptist Association, the Tennessee Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.

Article III – Seating Messengers

1. Each church shall be entitled to five messengers. Each church shall be entitled to one additional messenger for each 50 members over 100 until a maximum of 10 is reached. Said representatives shall be messengers to the association upon credentialing at the Annual Meeting.
2. A two-thirds (2/3) majority shall be necessary to refuse to seat messengers from a member church.
3. A two-thirds (2/3) majority shall be necessary to seat messengers from a new church.

Article IV – Visitors

Visitors may be invited to be seated in the body with all privileges except that of voting or speaking to a motion in regular business session.

Article V – Officers

1. The regular officers to be elected by the association shall be moderator, vice moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and assistant treasurer.
 - a. The moderator and vice moderator shall be nominated from the floor.
 - b. All others officers shall be nominated by the Administrative Leadership Team.
 - c. No one shall serve as moderator for more than two (2) consecutive years.
2. The duties of the moderator shall be to preside over all meetings of the association, put all proper motions to the body, appoint committees not otherwise provided for and see that a suitable decorum is preserved in the meetings. The moderator shall also serve as chairman of the executive committee. The moderator shall be an ex-officio member of all committees/teams.

3. The duties of the vice moderator shall be to perform the functions of the moderator in his absence and to assist in any other ways that the moderator or association may desire. The vice moderator shall be an ex-officio member of all committees/teams.
4. The duties of the clerk shall be to keep correct records of the proceedings of the annual associational meetings and the executive committee meetings together with a list of the messengers composing them and publishing them in due form and time.
5. The treasurer shall make authorized disbursements of all associational funds. The treasurer shall make a monthly report to the executive committee and an annual report to the association showing all receipts and disbursements.

Article VI – Authority

The association recognizes the autonomy of the local churches and shall exercise no authority over them. It shall nevertheless, be the duty of the association to offer fraternal counsel to any church upon request of said church. (Matthew 18: 15-17)

Article VII – Annual Meeting

1. The association shall hold an annual meeting at such time as the association may indicate.
2. A quorum shall be the messengers representing at least 50 percent of the cooperating Baptist churches.

Article VIII – Executive Committee

1. The association shall have an executive committee composed of the moderator, vice moderator and clerk of the association as its officers. One member and the pastor from each member church shall be members on the executive committee. For every 100 members or fraction thereof a church may appoint 1 (one) additional member up to a total of ten (10) executive committee members.
2. The executive committee shall transact the business of the association between annual sessions or any other business committed to it by the association in annual session.
3. A quorum will consist of those members present at the meeting.
4. It shall include meetings – the third Monday of February, May, and August.
5. The moderator in consultation with the Director of Missions, the vice moderator and the associational clerk shall be authorized to call the executive committee into special sessions.
6. A minimum of two weeks notice is required for a called Executive Committee Meeting.

Article IX – Revision

Any article of this constitution may be revised by said article being presented in printed form one year before the association is to vote. Any revision must be approved by a two-thirds (2/3) majority.

Article X – Procedures

1. The moderator elected at the previous meeting of the association shall give the executive committee report at the opening session, reviewing the work of the past year.
2. This Constitution and By-Laws and Robert’s Rules of Order shall be the standard of authority in parliamentary rulings.

BY-LAWS

1. Each meeting of the association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise and address the moderator; and while speaking, he shall confine himself strictly to the subject in question and shall not be interrupted unless he digresses from the subject, and in no wise reflects on any other speaker, to give fairly his own views of the cause without undue criticism. No member shall address another in any unchristian manner.

3. The moderator shall be entitled to the same privileges as any other member provided he vacates “the chair” but shall have no vote except in the case of a tie.
4. The names of the messengers shall be published in the Minutes as they have registered at the associational meeting.
5. The associational year shall be September 1 through August 31.
6. The associational fiscal year shall be January 1 – December 31.
7. By-Laws shall be revised by majority vote of the Executive Committee.
8. Associational Committees and their Duties.

Membership on all standing committees shall be on a rotation basis unless otherwise indicated, with one-third (1/3) elected annually for a three year term. No person shall succeed himself until one year has elapsed. Membership on all elected committees shall be distributed as far as possible among lay people and staff members of local churches.

The following committees shall serve the association and shall report to the bodies indicated. The composition and duties of these committees shall be as follows:

A. Personnel Committee

This committee shall be composed of three members. The committee shall screen all of those nominated to them by the appropriate committee for employment by the association. The committee shall call or recommend the employment or dismissal of employed personnel to the Executive Committee or the association in Annual Session.

B. Finance Committee

This committee shall be composed of six (6) members: The treasurer and financial secretary shall be ex-officio members. This committee shall:

1. Recommend procedures and plans for all money matters connected with work in the Concord Association and report to the Executive Committee on matters related to the financial status of the association.
2. The committee shall prepare the budget for the association’s consideration and approval. The proposed budget will be mailed to the Executive Committee members prior to the Annual Meeting at which time the budget will be voted on by the Executive Committee and forwarded to the association for final approval.
3. Promote a program of stewardship education and clinics on church finance.
4. Encourage churches to contribute and to increase contributions to the cooperative Program and associational missions through their church budgets.

9. Associational Teams and their Duties.

Team members will be recruited or accepted to work on specific tasks and move toward performance groups. Teams may have defined membership who may serve indefinite terms based on task completion. The team leaders will be chosen by the Administrative Leadership Team. Members will be approved by the Administrative Leadership Team for a specific team. The number of members per team may vary as determined by the Administrative Leadership Team. Team leaders will be elected at an Executive Board or the Annual Meeting. Team Leaders will serve only one team at a time.

Team members, by definition are persons who have expertise, gifts, skills and preferences to complete a certain task or mission.

A. Mission and Ministry Team Shall:

- (1) Develop and implement the mission and ministry plans of the association.
- (2) Train, develop and encourage church and associational workers.
- (3) Provide opportunities for working together in missions and ministry.
- (4) Report to Executive Committee as necessary.

B. Church Support Team Shall:

- (1) Develop and implement support to ministries within the churches.
- (2) Coordinate training events for ministries inside the churches.
- (3) Encourage fellowship groups
- (4) Offer consultation and support to church staff with responsibilities in area of church programs.

C. Evangelism Team Shall:

- (1) Develop and implement evangelism strategies for the association.
- (2) Coordinate training events to encourage evangelism efforts in local churches.
- (3) Offer consultation and support to local church staff in the area of evangelism.

D. Administrative Leadership Team Shall;

- (1) Serve as a coordinating team for the total mission of the association.
- (2) Be empowered to act for and on behalf of the Executive Board between meetings of the board.
- (3) Create, adjust and dissolve teams as needed to accomplish the mission of the association.

- (4) Review proposals and make recommendations to the Executive Board concerning the constitution.

TRUSTEES

1. The association shall elect three trustees, each to serve three years, with their terms to rotate that the term of one will expire each year. The chair shall be selected by the Administrative Leadership Team.
2. Any vacancy occurring between Annual Meetings shall be filled by the Executive Committee upon recommendation of the Administrative Leadership Team.
3. The trustees shall be the legal representatives of the association and shall act for the association upon orders of the Executive Committee. Their responsibility involves all legal matters, protecting the interests of the association where any process of law is required.

CONCORD BAPTIST ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING

October 18, 2010

Session One – 5:15 PM

Fellowship Hall, First Baptist Church, Murfreesboro, TN

The 2010 annual meeting of Concord Baptist Association was hosted by First Baptist Church, Murfreesboro with the first session opening with a fellowship supper. The session was called to order by Moderator, Rev. Ron Byers at 6:00 PM. Dr. Michael Smith opened the session with prayer of thanksgiving and a blessing for the meal

Rev. Byers proceeded with the seating of the messengers. He then reviewed the reports from the Executive Committee, Director of Missions, Financial, Administrative Team, and the Baptist Collegiate Ministry. Glen Wallace, Baptist Collegiate Director, Middle Tennessee State University, spoke to the Baptist Collegiate Report. (see attached book of reports)

William Hopper, chairman of the Budget Committee, gave an overview of the proposed budget for 2011. Total proposed budget is \$190,742.00. No discussion. Motion was made to accept the report. (see attached reports)

Lenny Farmer, dismissed session one with prayer at 6:15 PM. The next session will convene at 7:00 PM in the sanctuary.

Session Two - 7:00 PM

Sanctuary, First Baptist Church, Murfreesboro

Opening prayer and welcome delivered by Dr. Michael Smith, pastor, First Baptist Church, Murfreesboro. The meeting was called to order by the moderator, Rev. Ron Byers with a historic gavel that was carved from a tree cut on the original property on Hwy. 231.

Dr. Gary Rickman was introduced and brought greetings from the staff of the Tennessee Baptist Convention and from the Executive Director-Treasurer, Dr. Randy Davis in form of a media presentation. Dr. Davis challenged our churches to sow the seeds across Tennessee with Acts 1:8 as emphasis.

The congregation sang the hymn “To God Be the Glory”.

Theme interpretation was given by Dr. Eugene Cotey, Retired Pastor, First Baptist, Murfreesboro. Dr. Cotey emphasized that the area known as Rutherford County was settled over 200 years ago with fur trappers, farmers and traders. The people needed the word of God then and this has not changed. The first meeting of the Concord Association was held at Smith Fork Baptist Church, Statesville, September 25, 1810 where moderator, Thomas Durham challenged the people from the scripture verses in Ephesians 2:19-22. We are to be one in the body of Christ.

The session was called into business by the moderator, Ron Byers.

Testimony presented by Ms. Flo Nicholson, Daughter-in-Law of Rev. A.M. Nicholson, first Director of Missions, Concord Association by media presentation.

Drama presentation “Fifth Sunday Meeting” (Aunt Tillie and Friends) script by Dr. Fred Rolater with Jeannette Rolater, Wanda Gatewood, and Alice Harrell.

Testimony was given by Dr. Ross Maroney, retired pastor, Stones River Baptist Church, Smyrna. His prayer is “may the association continue to plant churches in middle Tennessee and across the world and we continue to grow stronger in the years ahead”.

Choir special by First Baptist, Murfreesboro, “Christ Lives in Me”. David Whittle arrangement, Rev. Jerry Neeley, director.

Rev. Neeley led the congregation in singing of the hymn “Great Is thy Faithfulness”.

Testimony by media presentation, Rev. Joe Carpenter, Pastor, First Baptist, Eagleville. He stated that he was thankful for mentoring and discipleship from the associational pastors he has received in the three years he has been at Eagleville.

Media Presentation by DVD: Presentation of the history of Concord Association from the first meeting on September 25, 1810 at Smith Fork Baptist Church, Statesville, TN. The prayer is today as yesterday- “Lord, we ask you to lead and guide us in the coming days as we come together as a body of Christ”.

David Pittman, Director of Missions spoke to his report. (Report attached) David voiced appreciation to First Murfreesboro for their hospitality for the evening meal, facilities, and special music; Dr. Tony Long for the DVD/media testimonies and to the 200th Anniversary Planning Committee for the anniversary program.

Church Recognition by Dr. Lenny Farmer, Senior Adult Minister, Lifepoint Baptist Church and Vice-Moderator, Concord Association. Roll call of each church and representatives of the church were asked to stand in honor. We have 55 churches in the association. God’s blessings on each and every church.

This has been a very challenging year in the life of the Concord Baptist Association. As we take the time to look back over two hundred years of ministry there are many times when we faced almost unbelievable challenges. Civil war, two world wars, several economic recessions, and theological differences are examples of some of the things that we have faced as an association. But, through them all we have remained faithful to the challenges that we have faced and God has blessed our efforts. To God be the glory for the great things that He has done!

Today we continue to face new challenges. The main challenges that we have faced recently are economic in nature. Our national economy has been in recession for an extended period of time. This has been instrumental in creating a negative impact on every aspect of our lives. This includes our church and associational life.

The economic realities have created a new day for our association. As we went through the year we noticed a continual drop in church contributions to our budget. This was a new reality that could not be ignored. Since our only source of revenue to support our budget is our churches we felt compelled to do something.

In response to this current reality we chose to cut two staff positions from our association staff to balance our budget. This came after much discussion and prayer. This seemed to be the best solution although none of us were happy with it. You are encouraged to pray for Tim Fisher and Ellen Chapman as they move to a new phase in their lives.

The cooperative spirit in the association continues to be very strong. The fellowship is sweet and encouraging. While most church budgets are reflecting a drop in contributions other areas of ministry are vibrant, strong and healthy.

I went to my oncologist a couple of weeks ago and continue to get good reports. The multiple myeloma in my body continues to be inactive in spite of the fact that I have been off all chemotherapy for several months. My blood is returning to almost normal and my kidney function is not getting any worse. I am now back to a normal work week and am available to our churches as need arises. God has been extremely gracious to me.

My name is Glenn Wallace and I am the new BCM campus minister for Middle Tennessee. I am excited to continue the strong tradition of BSU/BCM at MTSU. We have just completed the first few weeks of school. It has gone very well, as just over a hundred students have participated in our Week of Welcome and other ministries –from the returning student cookout to Noonday lunch, worship/Bible study, small group meetings and football tailgating.
